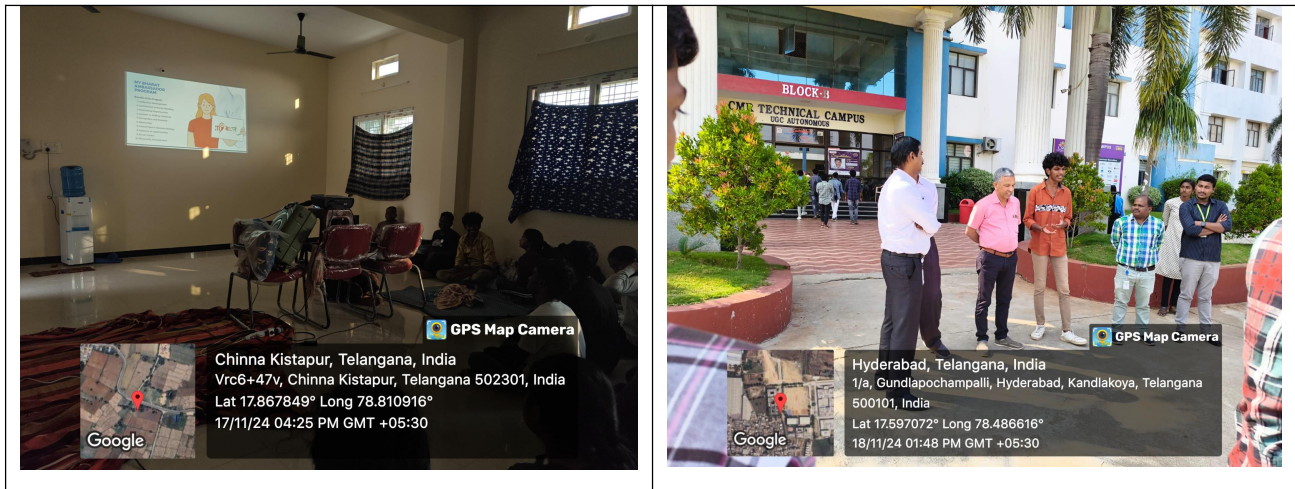
EVENT REPORT OF SPECIAL CAMP DAY 7
